#### Level of Care Assessments

- 36.5% identified
  Suboxone/Subutex as the drug of choice in 16/17
- 34.3% identified Heroin/Opiates as the drug of choice in 15/16

# Strategies to Combat the Opioid Epidemic

- Warm Hand Off Process
- Health Navigator
- Drug Take Back Boxes
- Naloxone Training



#### Warm Hand Off Process

- To ensure that overdose survivors immediately enter treatment following an overdose.
- Involves collaboration with multiple agencies and facilities.
- Warm Hand Off Policy

### Health Navigator

Assist with Level of Care Assessments

- Educate the community, family and loved ones of individuals with a substance use disorder
- Assist individuals with substance use disorders to navigate a cumbersome system

#### Drug Take Back Boxes

- Turn in used or expired medications for safe disposal
- Liquids, Syringes, Thermometers, Ointments, Lotions and Aerosol Cans are not accepted at the boxes
